It is over 44 years since the killings in highly disputed circumstances of six unarmed local men, Jim Sloan, Jim McCann, Tony Campbell, Brendan Maguire, John Loughran and Ambrose Hardy and the severe wounding of Charlie Carson. Despite sustained efforts to get the British State to assist in revealing the truth about how and why the six men died on that fateful night, to this day the families continue to be denied full disclosure.

Two years after the epic 1981 H-Block Hunger Strike in which ten young republicans died, another unforgettable event took place at Long Kesh that dealt a huge blow to Margaret Thatcher who



believed she had defeated the Republican prisoners. This was the escape of 38 IRA prisoners from H-Block 7 on Sunday 25th September 1983. To this day, the H-Block Prison escape is the biggest breakout in British and Irish history – and it is also the biggest escape since World War II. 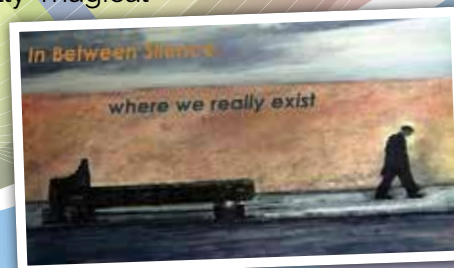
