



The ramps and steps at North Queen Street have been a legacy of previous building of the Westlink.

There have been decades of problems with the entire strip of land along the Motorway.



The left over spaces are owned by 3 different agencies, DfI Roads, Council and NIHE.

This makes it difficult for residents to address issues of maintenance and misuse.



The forthcoming York Street Interchange which will widen the bridge at North Queen Street, we argued the area should be re-designed and addressed.

The steps can be replaced with a rising path.



The path can take two routes, one could connect into Queens Parade.

We suggest local management is crucial; a residents board and contributions from local organisations can help run and maintain the park.

Local park wardens could be employed and projects within the park could secure its use by residents.
